Dear Friends,

‘You must have a look!’ ‘Ok, I will,’ – hoping I wouldn’t just forget. But I did have a look – and it’s well worth you having a look as well. Google **Makenzy Beard** and have a look at her paintings.

She is only 14, and only took up painting during lockdown last year. This year she had her work displayed in the Royal Academy of Art in London, has been acclaimed by those who know what they talking about, and has her work selling for thousands. Her observation of personality and character is amazing.

And then there was Earthshot – Prince William’s supported effort to promote developments to help overcome climate change. Again Google **Vinisha Umashankar**, another 14 year old – this time from India. Particularly find her speech at the COP26 conference. There is so much hope in our youngsters – and we need to listen to them.

I am taken to the passage in Isaiah’s prophecies:

The wolf will lie down with the lamb, the leopard with the goat, the calf and the lion will feed together ...

A great picture of harmony in the created order and in this world. And then:

A little child will lead them.

We see it often as fulfilled in the coming of Jesus. And that coming we celebrate at Christmas, a time so much seen as the festival of the child.

Dare we let the child lead us? Dare we listen to the concerns of the youngsters – especially with relation to climate and all the associated issues? Dare we let the Child of Christmas that God has given us show us his way?

‘Oh, but it is so complicated,’ we say. ‘You don’t understand.’ But maybe that is our problem – we can’t see the wood for the trees. We make it so complicated.

This Christmas, can we let the child help us see the simplicity of it all, help us cut through the dross, the excuses, the rationality? Our school is nurturing character virtues in our children, helping them to be inspiring changemakers. Then the insight of the youngster and the experience of the grown up can bring about real change. It is the challenge of the Christmas Child.

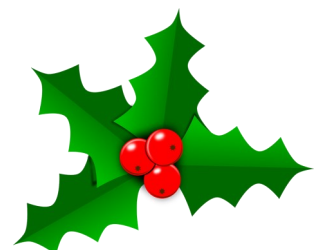

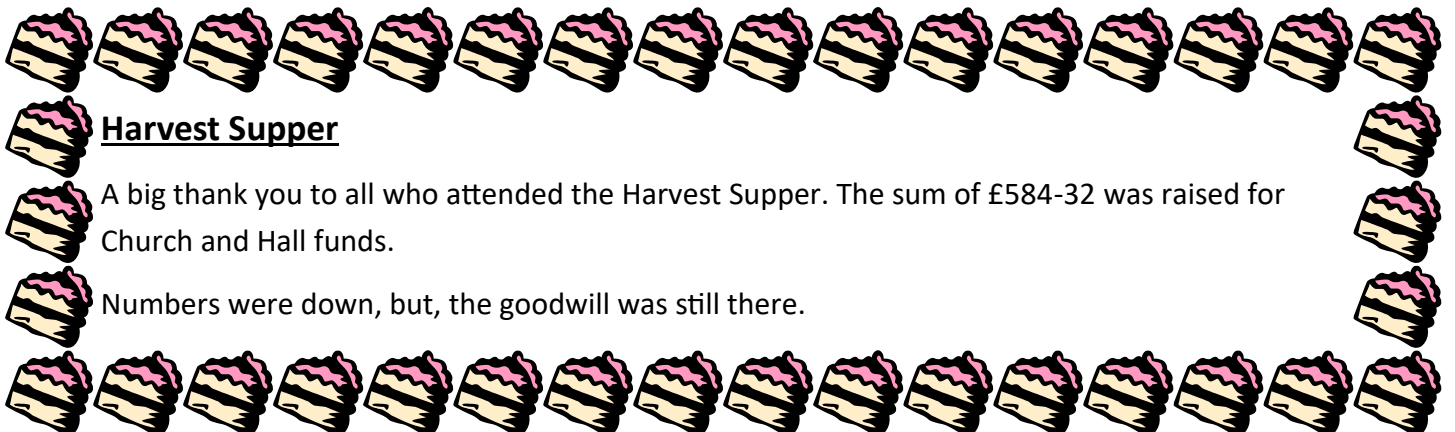

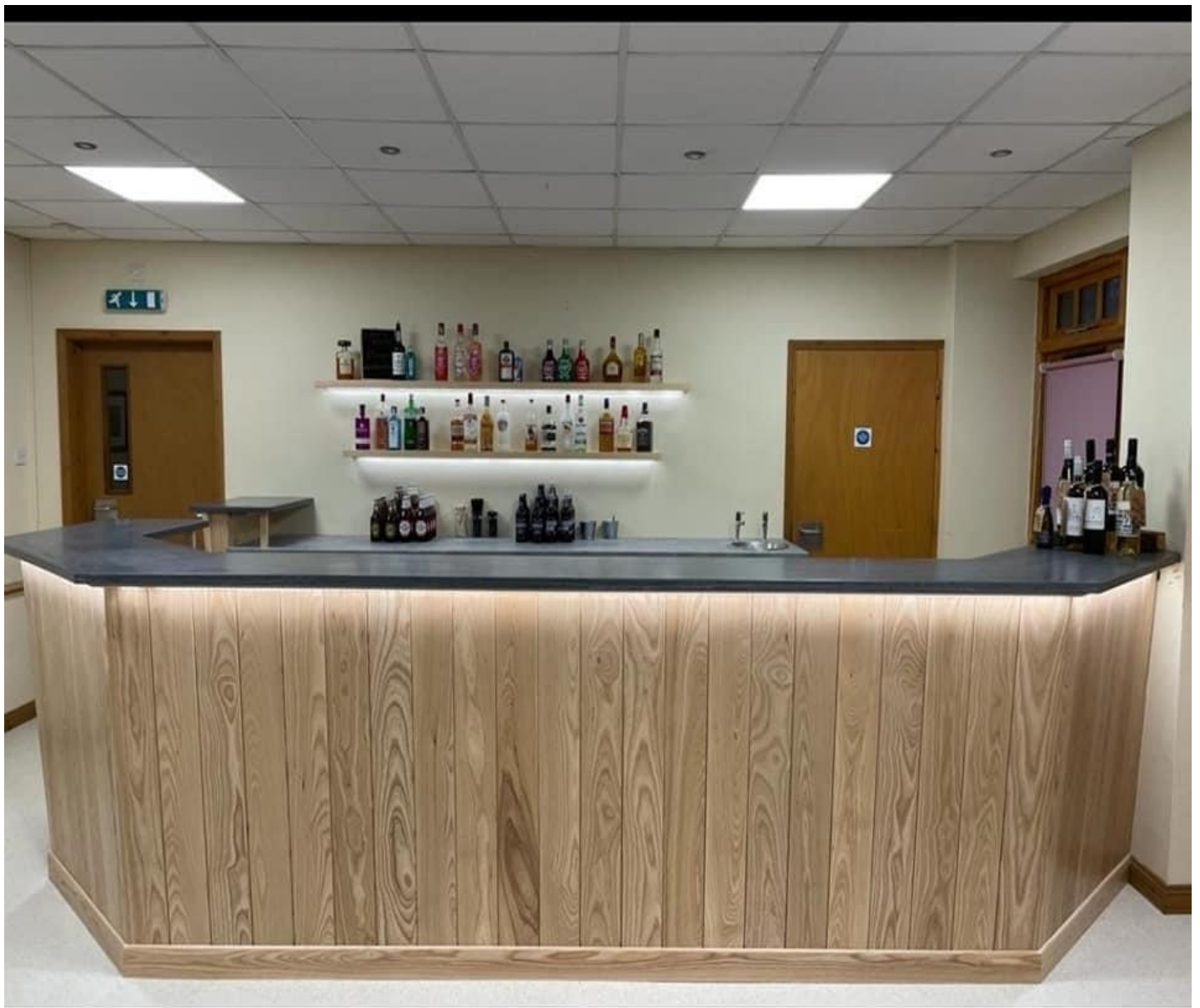

During a recent turn-out we came across an old recipe book from the Devon W.I. We are not sure of the date but it was edited by Mrs Blackmore of Peter's Marland WI who had tested every recipe, so that the most inexperienced cooks could proceed with confidence!

We have selected a couple of recipes for you to try. We would be particularly interested in anyone trying the first one, the Old Testament Cake and reporting on the results.

OLD TESTAMENT CAKE

4½ cups	1 Kings iv, 22
½ lb.	Judges v. 25
2 cups	Jeremiah vi, 20
2 cups	Nahum iii, 12
2 cups	1 Samuel xxx, 12
2 cups	Numbers xvii, 8
2 teaspoons	1 Samuel xiv, 25
To taste	2 Chronicles ix, 9
6	Jeremiah xvii, 11
1½ cups	Judges iv, 19
2 teaspoons	Amos iv, 5
1 pinch	Leviticus ii, 13
Directions	Proverbs xxiii, 14

Bake 1½ to 2 hours

(Note: Baking powder can be used instead of yeast).

The next recipe was from Mrs F. M. Broer of Merton W.I. Probably there are still people in the village who will remember her.

DUTCH APPLE CAKE PUDDING (*Delicious short appley pudding served with custard*)

8 ozs. Self-raising flour
 6 ozs. Margarine
 4 ozs. Sugar
 A pinch of salt
 2 large apples
 Swiss roll tin, well greased
 Sugar for sprinkling
 1 egg

Rub in fat to flour, add sugar and salt.

Then mix to a stiff mixture with beaten egg.

Spread mixture on tin.

Arrange sliced apple in rows over pudding and lastly sprinkle with sugar.

Cook in moderate oven

Merton and Petrockstowe Heritage Group

Our walk around the Bellever Forest was fascinating in spite of wet and windy weather. The forest itself was planted in the 1920s and is now a conservation area for the Dartmoor Pony Heritage Trust. Bob Adamson our guide was very knowledgeable and showed us the bronze age sites within the forest area including Kraps Ring a settlement of around 9 hut circles surrounded by a wall. These round houses would have been made of stone with wooden roof timbers covered in turf, gorse or thatch. A fire pit was made in the centre of the dwelling with smoke going up through the roof which would have got rid of bugs and water proofed it. The animals would have been brought into the hut at night with the humans to protect them from wild animals

Bob also showed us a stone row and a Cairn. We hope to do another walk in the spring.

Janet Few is our speaker for November is she is talking about women's occupations from selling matchsticks to working in munitions factories, making gloves and working on farms. Always an interesting speaker we shall look forward to her visit.

In January we shall be hosting a tea and chat afternoon on Friday 21st at 2.30 p.m. in the Chapel. We are inviting older villagers to come and reminisce on what it was like to live in Petrockstowe as a child and how the village has changed over the years. News from Rotary Club of Torrington

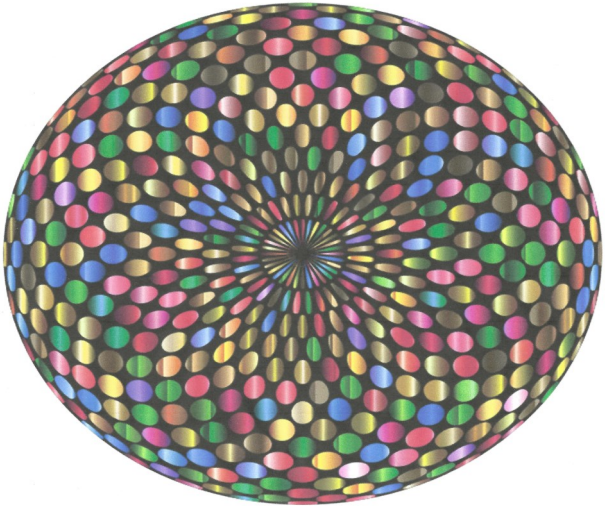

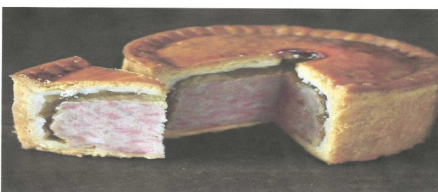
